We are honored to share this heartwarming news! In response to the "Wish List" in our Spring 2009 newsletter, alum Dr. Jim Brooks contacted us and expressed his desire to fund a quality mountain bike program at camp in memory of his brother, Dr. Tom Brooks. Jim shares that, as a camper, Tom was completely "enthralled" with camp life at Camp Carson and because he also loved mountain biking, this donation seemed a great fit in two ways.

The Program ~ Jim agreed with us that camp is the ideal place to introduce this activity to young people and as Jim noted, perhaps the only opportunity some children will ever have to ride in the woods – a great experience. As a YMCA facility that is concerned with serving spirit, mind and body, this program greatly aids us in our desire to help families combat the physical inactivity of young people. We have all witnessed how video games and computer technology have contributed to our youth moving indoors and becoming less and less active. We also know that camp is a place where children are given extended periods of time in the outdoors and that we have the luxury of offering many programs to our campers that they would never experience if it were not for the outdoor camp life.

Jim's gift has enabled camp to purchase 20 quality, 2010 Wahoo Gary Fischer Trek mountain bikes, 2 bike racks, helmets and other safety gear, spare parts and will build a storage and maintenance barn (the program will also include instruction on the proper way to maintain

and repair the bikes). It is our hope that this program will have a tremendous positive impact on our campers - that not only will they have fun but that perhaps they will also find lifetime enjoyment in the physical activity of biking.

In Memory of Tom Brooks

Jim Brooks

Jim began his association with the YMCA at a young age as the Brooks family routinely participated in the Y programs. He has fond memories of Pancake Days at the downtown Y where he remembers eating his fair share of pancakes while his mother The mountain bike program is donated in memory of Jim's older brother Tom. Jim is actually twelve years younger than Tom so we had to do a little homework to find out more about Tom's years at camp. From our discussions, we believe Tom attended camp as

volunteered at the ticket table. He also learned to swim at the downtown Y and had his first introduction to sailing at YMCA Camp Carson. Jim attended Camp Carson for two summers and said his memories all center around the waterfront activities. He continued his camping experience while attending Boy Scout and Young Life camps.

Currently, Jim practices Optometry at the Boston VA Medical Center which is also a teaching hospital. Jim spends the majority of his time working with and

training optometry students and residents and thoroughly enjoys his work. When he is not working, Jim can often be caught sailing off the shores of Camp Cod in a 38 ft. sailing vessel or competing in open water swimming events. He also participates in road and mountain biking.

We appreciate Jim's personal investment in this program and look forward to introducing it to our campers for the first time this summer.

a camper from 1954-1960 and served on the staff from 1961-1964. His best friend, Larry Miller, had this to say about Tom. "Like me, at camp, Tom learned to swim, canoe, sail, cook on a camp fire, shoot bows and arrows, rifles, sing camp songs and play sports. Tom went to camp ALL summer, for weeks. He had the right attitude, was good at everything and earned a felt award in every activity possible. If you were a certain level as a swimmer and boater, you could take canoe trips on all the Indiana rivers, the Patoka, the White, the Wabash and the Ohio. Tom did all of them – even the 3 week trips."

Because of the age difference, Jim says that his personal time at camp was separate from Tom's but he

does remember that Tom loved diving off of the high dive and organizing the canoe trips. Leonard Schlamp, who led the Honor Cabin, said he actually remembers the first day Tom Brooks was in the Honor Cabin because he was just so much smaller than the rest of the boys. Tom was also the recipient of the Kerr Award which was awarded to the camper of the year each summer. It doesn't take long to learn that when Tom took an interest in something, he went "all out".

Tom was an orthopedic surgeon in a private practice, Upper Cape Orthopedics, where he remained a partner until his retirement in 1998. Throughout his life, Tom continued to be a very active outdoorsman. He routinely enjoyed mountain biking, big game hunting, rock climbing, ice climbing, fishing, skiing and also served on ski patrol for a few years. Sadly, Tom was killed in an automobile accident on January 2, 2002. After the accident, Leonard later wrote to Tom's mother and shared with her, that although he had come into contact with a huge number of campers, Tom stood out in his mind as one of the best.

We want to express our deep gratitude for Jim's gift and for the touching way he chose to celebrate Tom's vibrant life at camp and beyond. The joy we receive when we watch our campers ride those forest trails, with smiles on their faces, will be made all the sweeter when we reflect on how it came to be. Somehow, we think Tom will be smiling too.


