CLOUD STUDY

ELEMENTARY

With the aid of a personally created "weather window", students will learn to identify different types of cloud, and make a prediction about the forecast for the next day.

PREDATOR-PREY PLAY

ELEMENTARY

Students will learn about the importance of the relationships between predators and prey in this series of highly active tag-based simulations.

ENCHANTED FOREST

ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students will explore the forest and learn to appreciate nature using their senses of sight, smell, touch, and hearing.

MICROHIKE

ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students will utilize a magnifying glass to explore the incredible microscopic world all around them.




INVADERS!

UPPER ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students will learn about several species of wildlife that are invasive to Indiana and participate in a full-body movement game that simulates how invasive species compete with native species for habitat and resources.



ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL Students will use their sight, touch, and smell to identify the trees at Camp and will work to create a system to help distinguish each type of tree.

MAP CHALLENGE

UPPER ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL Students will learn how to read several styles of map in order to find tokens hidden around camp.

AMAZING RACE

UPPER ELEMENTARY TO HIGH SCHOOL

Students will race to complete a series of physical and academic challenges in order to be declared the winner of this camp-wide "escape room" style challenge.

CREEK HIKES

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students will have the opportunity to explore Camp Carson's creek and will identify different environmental factors that can influence the health of a body of water. (requires 2 activity blocks).



OIL SPILL MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students will learn about oil spill and their subsequent cleanup methods in this Design Process Thinking lesson.

CAMP CARSON SURVIVOR

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students will work together to build a fire, purify water, and build a shelter in this hands-on survival simulation.



MIDDLE SCHOOL AND HIGH SCHOOL

Students will study the skulls and bones of common Indiana Wildlife and discuss how the different structures have adapted overtime to allow the organism to survive in its habitat.



RECREATION OPTIONS



CLIMBING WALL

Students will enjoy climbing our 35-foot portable climbing wall.

CANOEING

Students will canoe around the scenic Lake Seminole.



ARTS & CRAFTS

Students can explore art projects, create tie dye t-shirts, or will learn how to create their own working candle.



Students will have a chance to hit the mark at our portable outdoor archery range.



WATER ZIPLINE

Students will be harnessed to a cable 30 feet high and released down a 500 foot zipline that splashes into Lake Seminole.



RECREATION OPTIONS



ALPINE TOWER

Students will enjoy this 50 foot climbing tower that can be used to develop a sense of trust, accomplishment, communication, and/or for recreation. (recommended 6th grade and up)

POTTERY HANDBUILDING

Students will create works of art with air dry clay.





BLACK HOLE

Students will sled down our 80 foot tunnels.

WOOD SHOP

Students will learn wood shop safety as they complete beautiful artisan projects with our scroll saws and wood burning pens (6th grade & up)



TEAMBUILDING & TEAM BONDING

A customizable program, working with a YMCA Camp Carson staff member to develop appropriate activities specific to the needs of your students. These activities can be facilitated with groups as large 200+ people, or as small as 10.



Team Building vs. Team Bonding

Different groups seek different outcomes from their experience at Camp Carson, and our program allows you to customize your activities to reach the desired outcome. Our Team Bonding activities provide an experience for the group to work together to overcome challenges, whereas Team Building is more focused on activities that really challenge group dynamics.

Low Ropes vs. Initiatives

Low ropes are a series of more traditional camp team-building opportunities, more close quarters & physical than other challenges or Initiatives Low Ropes are designed to encourage groups to plan ahead and think creatively as they work together to solve these more physical challenges. Initiatives are designed to give the whole group a platform with which to demonstrate and grow their strategy, effective communication, and problem solving abilities. Both can be used to facilitate conversations about group dynamics and communication.



You may sign up for as many Team building or Team bonding blocks as you would like. Speak with a Camp Carson representative to develop a schedule

EVENING PROGRAMS (EPs)

ORGANIZED MASS CHAOS

Each players attempts to complete as many tasks as possible, but they may be interrupted to help other players complete their tasks during the game.

NIGHT HIKE

Explore the night, learn some tricks, and hear a great story.



HOOTENANNY

Your students take center stage as <u>they</u> perform some classic camp skits.

S'MORES FIRE

Enjoy a relaxing evening around the campfire while enjoying a camp favorite treat.
